ORDER ON CASCADE ORTHOPEDIC SUPPLY INC.'S MOTION FOR CLARIFICATION

By Order dated July 6, 2018, several non-parties' motions for *in camera* treatment, including the motion filed by Cascade Orthopedic Supply Inc. ("Cascade") were ruled upon ("July 6 Order"). On July 20, 2018, Cascade filed a motion for clarification. Neither Complaint Counsel nor Respondent has filed an opposition to this motion.

The July 6 Order granted Cascade's motion for *in camera* treatment with regard to all of the designated portions of the transcript of Jeffrey Collins' deposition (RX0999/PX5120) ("Collins transcript"). In listing the designated portions for which in camera treatment was granted by page and line numbers, the July 6 Order did not include the index portion of the Collins transcript. Cascade now seeks clarification as to whether the index portion is accorded in camera treatment. Cascade asserts that the index portion meets the standard for in camera treatment because someone searching the index could easily determine what words had been redacted in the public version of the transcript itself, thus effectively eliminating some of the benefit of granting in camera treatment to portions of the transcript. In order to preserve the confidential protection for the portions of the deposition transcript that contain competitively sensitive information, Cascade's Motion is GRANTED. In camera treatment, for a period of five years, to expire July 1, 2023, is GRANTED for the index portion of RX0999/PX5120.
