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

**DECLARATION OF JOHN D. GRAUBERT IN SUPPORT OF SHIRE'S PETITION TO  
LIMIT OR QUASH SUBPOENA AD TESTIFICANDUM  
DATED SEPTEMBER 4, 2014**

I, John D. Graubert, declare under penalty of perjury pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746:

1. I am over the age of 18 years and am a partner at Covington & Burling LLP. In that capacity, I represent Shire as successor to ViroPharma, in this matter.
2. On Monday, September 22, 2014, as required by 16 C.F.R. § 2.7(k), I engaged in a pre-petition meeting with FTC staff attorneys. Present at that meeting representing Shire were: Michael Riffitts of Shire plc, and John Graubert, Edward Rippey, David Shaw, and David Kronig of Covington & Burling LLP. Present at the meeting representing the FTC were: June Im, Linda Blumenreich, and Meredyth Andrus.
3. At that meeting, Shire representatives discussed Shire's objections to the subpoena issued to the company on September 4, 2014, and offered alternative ways for staff to obtain the information they were seeking. I also requested that the response date for this petition be extended in order to engage in further discussions with staff about narrowing the scope of the subpoena. FTC staff indicated they would discuss that request.
4. FTC counsel June Im declined the request for an extension of the filing of a petition to quash in a voice message left for me at 9:45 am on Tuesday, September 23, 2014.
