RE: Business Opportunity Rule, R511993

Dear Federal Trade Commissioners,

I have been in the network marketing business for 25 years and enjoy the health benefits and lifestyle it provides me. I know that I would have cancer today had it not been for my Shaklee supplements and XanGo fruit juice. At age 67, I feel great. Better than at age 25.

MLM (multi-level marketing) allows me to work as much as or as little as I want to. Everyone should belong to an MLM company to receive residual income for the rest of their lives. XanGo is a very uncomplicated business with a company that has excellent business ethics and a quality product.

Please do not make it more complicated for me to conduct my business.

1. The 7 day waiting period requires more paper work and follow up
2. Elimination of the \$500 business threshold- Applies to businesses requiring a greater investment than a direct selling sales kit of \$35.
3. Earnings claims- Difficult to collect required data from all companies
4. References – Locating the nearest existing 10 sales people would be a privacy and safety issue as well as possible corporate liability for ID theft.

Everyone should have the same opportunity to feel good without the rules that you are now proposing. There are some fraudulent groups out there, but this particular rule unfairly targets legitimate direct selling businesses. Please do not continue with this new proposed rule.
