To whom it may concern,

We have been Independent Business Owners with the Quixtar business since September of 1999. We reached the level of Founder's Platinum last year and are working toward expanding our business by helping others of our partners reach this level as well. This business has provided great monetary rewards and has become a major source for our livelihood. We first joined in Montana hoping to make \$200 extra per month and now have an income that has generated thousands. We moved from Montana to Utah where we bought a home and reside there and also in Arizona.

The business has benefited us in many other ways besides just monetarily with our involvement in the educational portion of our support system and association with others that are even more successful than we are.

When we registered, we had plenty of information to know whether we wanted to become involved or not. Especially considering the low start up cost and satisfaction guarantee, we felt there was little risk. We certainly had spent more money on other things that didn't give us the value in return that this business has. Today even more information is provided for those looking to join than there was available when we joined. In fact, information for any prospects looking at joining this business seems to me to be limited only to the prospects willingness to read, listen and talk with those who can answer their questions.

Our prospects are always told that this is not a "get rich quick" plan and every tape that we use to help educate them about the program explains that there is no guarantee of success.

Our prospects typically spend about \$50 to \$150 to register and understand that they can get their money back without question if not satisfied.

A seven-day waiting period requirement would be of great detriment to our ability to continue building our business. When we travel to other states to talk to prospects, we often are not there for seven days and so this requirement would cause great burden on our ability to accomplish growing our business. Often in the course of registering someone new, the new IBO has close relationships with others who are anxious to get started at or near the same time. We have seen this with as many as half a dozen people that are ready to get started one right after the other. If the newest person had to wait 7 days before he could get his prospects registered, instead of increasing our business by 6 or 7 IBOships, we would probably have zero. It would be like being excited about buying a car and then being told you couldn't buy it until 7 days after you first looked at it. Profitability of car dealerships and our Quixtar business would quickly plummet.

A requirement to provide a list of local IBOs would be a great detriment to our business. In many areas that we have been, we have not known who other IBOs in the area are. We would have great concern that after we did the work of selling the prospect on our business that if we were required to provide a reference list, that they would join with someone on that list because of some previous relationship. We can think of no other business where the government requires references from their competition. Also, we would not want to be bombarded by people contacting us as a reference for someone else. This would violate our privacy rights. We have regular meetings where prospects

can meet other IBOs and get to know those IBOs who will be directly helping them build their business.

A requirement to provide a “litigation list” seems to us to be more governmental red tape that would hamper our ability to build a successful business. In the proposal, there is no clear definition of “seller” and being swayed by cases filed that have no merit is a burden on the prospect that is unfair. We would not want our business judged by the actions of some IBO 10 states away that builds his business based on principles differently than ours.
