My husband and I are writing this letter because in reference to the proposed Business Opportunity Rule R511993. This ruling in its present form could prevent us from continuing to succeed in our home based business. We are independent distributors for a nutritional company called Xango.

We have been independent distributors for them for 9 months. The product has helped us greatly with health concerns such as diabetes, high blood pressure and cholesterol. Our family is depending on this business as being one of our sources of income. We believe that the small business owners represent what this country stands for in the pursuit of fulfilling the American dream. The small business owners play a large part in the economy of the United States. Don't you agree? We are deeply concerned that this proposed change would drastically hurt our and hundreds of thousands of other people's small businesses.

We honestly believe that you have our best interest at heart and really want to protect people by this proposed Business Opportunity Rule R511993, but whoever came up with this proposal did not think it on how this could negatively affect the hundreds of thousands of American business owners, as well as the international ones. Some of the sections in the proposed rule could make it difficult or almost impossible for us to sell our product or build our business.

This 7 day waiting period would make someone think that there's something not quite right with us or our business and would not feel comfortable doing business with us. We are professional and caring people and we value our reputation and the opinion of the people in our community concerning our business. We would like to be treated as such. We truly believe this waiting period is unnecessary. Our company, Xango, stands behind their product and we do too. Xango already has a 100% buyback policy.

This will make the small business owners look like we are trying to cheat or scam the average person, especially if they don't have to go through the same process when they buy large purchases like a house or a car. The small business owners are honest, hard working, law abiding, tax paying citizens, not criminals.

Under this waiting period requirement, the paperwork requires us to keep very detailed records the first time we speak with a prospect. Then we would then have to send in reports to our company. We already have a lot of paperwork to keep up with as business owners and for the government.

The proposed rule also requires the disclosure of a minimum of 10 prior purchasers nearest to the prospective purchaser. If they are the first purchaser how can there be ten prior to them. Some people don't like companies giving out their names as references. We have a health product and we should not have to tell strangers the names of anyone else who is taking it.

The average drug store is not required to give their customers the names of 10 people close to them that are taking the drug their customer is buying from them. People would sue a drug store for revealing that type of information. We should not have to give out customers names either. It should be against the law not made a law. If a company had to give my name and information out to other customers I would not join or purchase their products. Identity theft is too much of a threat for people in this country as it is without adding more opportunities for it to grow. It appears we are starting to lose more of our freedoms in the land of the free daily.

Crooks are going to find a way to cheat and scam people no matter what we do. Instead of making it hard for honest businesses, make it harder for the crooks. Educate people more on how not to get scammed.

Please don't allow this proposed Business Opportunity Rule R511993 to pass. Help us as citizens and business owners to continue to operate our businesses with integrity and be treated with respect as all other legitimate business owners are treated.
