

My husband and I have been registered as Quixtar IBO's for 10 years, and although we have not reached the Diamond level, we have found this business to be the vehicle to fulfill our dreams. It is something we can work towards together, instead of in separate careers. In a world of furloughs and plant closings, this business provides the opportunity for a family to supplement their income, while they are still working a their current job, to reduce their dept, and/or increase their savings. We know that doing the work that is needed to build a successful Quixtar business, is the only way that we will be rewarded, and we're not afraid of the work. Our sponsors have always been eager to help, and have been forthright with us. This business not only provides financial freedom, but also a team of people working together to help each other reach their goals and succeed. It fits into a busy person's lifestyle, and provides adequate flexibility.

The registration fee is less than \$150.00, and includes sample products of the IBO's choice. We provide information (SA-4400) to new prospects, which outlines sample businesses and typical incomes, as is required by the Quixtar Corporation. We explain that it is not a get-rich-quick business, but it is an opportunity to be rewarded, if you put in the work. There is a money back guarantee, however there are no guarantees of success, because this is based on their willingness to do the work. Regardless of whether or not the new IBO utilizes the training materials that are available; we will still help them grow their business as much as we can.

We feel strongly that a 7-day waiting period is unnecessary and could deter an ambitious person from pursuing. We provide all of the necessary information to allow a prospect to make an informed decision, and do not pressure them to register the same day they review the business plan. If they choose to wait 1-2 days to make a decision, they should not be required to wait 7 days. Purchases of other business types do not require this waiting period.

Our weekly workshops provide an atmosphere for prospects to meet current IBO's and establish a set of their own references. It is an open and friendly atmosphere where IBO's share their experiences and provide helpful tips. We are uncomfortable with providing personal information, including phone numbers and addresses of other IBO's to prospects, without their permission. I would not want my personal information given out to just anyone. That would be an infringement on my privacy. The proposed requirement to provide a litigation list could cause inflammatory issues, because not all cases that are filed are valid. Does this mean that all individual business owners in other industries will be expected to follow this requirement (e.g. doctors, lawyers, architects, and roofers)?

This business is a great opportunity for a large amount of people, many of who do not have the enormous funds to purchase a traditional business, pay rental fees and employee costs. It can be accomplished legitimately as a home based business, and help people of all nationalities, religions, etc, pursue and fulfill lifelong dreams. We certainly hope that the FTC will reconsider these stringent rules, and continue to support the legitimate IBO in their endeavor to provide an opportunity for the masses to improve their lives.
