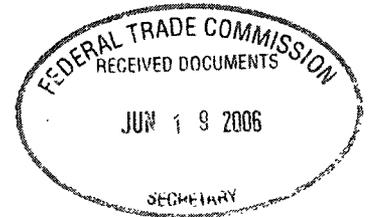

RE: Business Opportunity Rule, R511993



Dear Sir or Madam:

I am writing this letter because I am concerned about the proposed Business Opportunity Rule R511993. I understand that in its present form, it could prevent me from continuing as a Mannatech Assoc. I know that it is the responsibility of the FTC to protect the public from unfair practices, but some of the proposed rule will make it very difficult for me to sell Mannatech products.

In the section that talks about the seven day waiting period to enroll a new assoc. really concerns me. If we are being asked to do this why not impose the same restrictions on car sales or other products that cost a lot more than these products do. I feel this ruling is unnecessary because Mannatech already has a 90% buy back policy for all products including sales kits purchased by someone within the last twelve months. Under this waiting period I would be required to keep very detailed records when I first spoke to someone about Mannatech and then send more reports to headquarters.

The proposed rule requires the disclosure of information of a minimum of 10 prior purchasers nearest to the prospective purchaser. I work in healthcare and we are reminded every day about confidentiality. Well this rule would throw this right out the door. There are people who would not buy the products if they knew their personal information would be given out to others. There is too much identity theft out there to be giving out this kind of information to just anyone.

I have been a Mannatech Assoc. for 6 years. Originally, I became an assoc. to take the products and it has developed into a business for me. Now my family depends on the extra income to supplement our budget.

I appreciate the work the FTC does to protect consumers, but I believe this proposed new rule has many unintended consequences and that there are other alternatives available in achieving the same goals.
