COMPLAINT COUNSEL AND RESPONDENTS' STIPULATION EXTENDING THE DISCOVERY DEADLINE

 The end of the day on January 23, 2009 is the close of discovery, other than discovery permitted under Rule 3.24(a)(4), depositions of experts, and discovery for purposes of authenticity and admissibility of exhibits.
