Mr. Nathan is counsel for international antitrust at the U.S. Federal Trade Commission's Office of International Affairs (OIA), where his portfolio includes the FTC's bilateral relations with the Competition Commission of India as well as various ICN and OECD initiatives.

Mr. Nathan joined OIA in April 2019 after ten years in a variety of other capacities at the FTC, including serving as a competition attorney advisor to FTC Chairwoman Edith Ramirez with responsibility for a

wide variety of competition issues, including both international and healthcare matters. Both before and after his tenure with Chairwoman Ramirez, Mr. Nathan was a staff attorney in the FTC's Bureau of Competition, working on healthcare conduct matters involving anticompetitive reverse payments from branded to generic pharmaceutical companies, and various mergers, including in the chemical, healthcare, and semiconductor industries. During that time, he was the member of several successful trial teams and was responsible for both economic and industry experts, fact witnesses, and pre and post-trial briefing.

Prior to joining the FTC, Mr. Nathan was an antitrust associate at Arnold & Porter LLP, where he worked on U.S. and non-U.S. merger, conduct, and cartel matters in a variety of industries. Before entering private practice, he served as a law clerk for a federal judge in Philadelphia, PA. He graduated *cum laude* from the University of Michigan Law School in 2002, and received his undergraduate degree from Cornell University, *magna cum laude*.
