UNOPPOSED EXPEDITED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Respondent Facebook, Inc. (n/k/a Meta Platforms Inc.) ("Meta") hereby moves pursuant to 16 C.F.R. § 4.3(b) for an extension of time in which to file its answer to the Order to Show Cause issued by the Commission in the above-captioned matter on May 3, 2023 (the "OTSC"). Complaint Counsel has informed Meta that it takes no position on this motion.

On January 9, 2024, the Commission extended Meta's deadline to respond to the OTSC through March 15, 2024.¹ By order of the United States Court of Appeals for the District of

Columbia Circuit, Meta's response is currently the subject of an administrative stay pending further order from that Court.²

Given the uncertainty around if and when that stay might be lifted and the time required for Meta to file any response to the OTSC, Meta proposed to counsel to the Commission that its deadline to respond to the OTSC be extended until one business day after any stay or injunction expires. On March 19, 2024, counsel to the Commission informed Meta that the Commission is amenable to proceeding on that understanding, and Meta files this motion accordingly.

Therefore, Meta respectfully submits that there is good cause for the extension and that there is also good cause to waive the time requirements under 16 C.F.R. § 3.22 and to expedite its consideration of this request.³

WHEREFORE, for good cause shown, Meta respectfully requests that the Commission promptly grant the requested relief pursuant to 16 C.F.R. § 4.3(b) and waive the time requirements under 16 C.F.R. § 3.22.
