## ORDER REGARDING PARTY STATUS REPORTS AND RESETTING EVIDENTIARY HEARING

Having reviewed the parties' status reports, I hereby ORDER the following:

- 1. No additional motions for documents or other information arising from either the "Unredacted Document" or follow-up meet and confer sessions shall be filed.
- 2. The evidentiary hearing will take place on June 20, 2024, commencing at 9:00 a.m. Eastern Time.
- 3. Paragraph 2 of my March 25, 2024 Order Setting Evidentiary Hearing is modified as follows:

The evidentiary hearing will be limited to presenting evidence and argument probative of the likelihood that the presence of Altrenogest in Motion to Strike on June 24, 2023 arose from "cross-" (or "environmental") contamination, regardless of location or source, including the basis for any opinion offered on that subject.

I have modified the scope of the supplemental evidence that may be offered at the hearing because I have determined that the factual record from the arbitration hearing on this factual matter is insufficient.

- 4. By June 13, 2024, the parties must exchange and provide a courtesy copy to OALJ@FTC.GOV:
  - a. A list of the witnesses they anticipate calling;
  - b. A list of exhibits they wish to introduce; and
  - c. A list of attorneys or other individuals who are expected to participate in the hearing.

- 5. Any stipulations of fact shall be filed by June 18, 2024 with a courtesy copy sent simultaneously to <u>OALJ@FTC.GOV</u>.
- 6. Paragraphs numbered 3 through 5 and 7 in my March 25, 2024 Order, and all provisions of my May 9, 2024 Supplemental Order Regarding Exhibits and Evidence (as modified by the date deadlines above), continue to apply.
- 7. As directed in connection with the May 20, 2024 hearing:
  - a. Three attorneys may be located within the same physical room. If that is counsel's intention, please notify the ALJ office by email at OALJ@FTC.GOV.
  - b. Any slides that either side may seek to use on their opening statement should be provided to opposing counsel and the ALJ by June 18, 2024. They will become part of the evidentiary record.
