**ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME
AND RESETTING BRIEFING SCHEDULE**

Based on the parties’ informing me that, although there is a video recording of the Arbitration in this matter, there was no written transcript, I issued my August 8, 2024 Order on Joint Request Regarding Citation to Witness Testimony. That Order noted the need for a written transcript of the Arbitration and thus directed, in pertinent part, that the parties “confer on the amount of time they need[ed]” to arrange for a transcript and to “submit a Joint Request for an Extension of Time” to prepare their briefs and related papers on this review proceeding.

In response to the August 8 Order, the parties, by emailed letter, jointly requested the following schedule, which I hereby **ORDER** into effect:

1. By August 28, 2024, the parties shall jointly file a written transcript of the Arbitration, to be denominated “Appeal Book 2”.
2. By September 11, 2024, the parties shall each file their proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law, and a proposed order, together with a supporting legal brief providing the party’s reasoning.
3. By September 23, 2024, the parties shall file any Reply findings of fact, conclusions of law, and briefs.

As noted in my August 5, 2024 Order on Application for Review and Application for Stay, in this case the word limits in FTC Rule 1.146(c)(3) are applied to all of the filings in the aggregate, and **not** individually to each filing listed in that Rule.
