UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME FOR NON-PARTY MERCER (US) LLC TO MOVE TO LIMIT OR QUASH SUBPOENA

Non-party Mercer (US) LLC ("Mercer"), by and through its undersigned counsel, moves pursuant to Rules 3.22, 3.34, and 4.3(b) of the Federal Trade Commission's Rules of Practice for Adjudicative Proceedings to extend the time to move to quash or limit the subpoena *duces tecum* (the "Subpoena") served by Respondents Express Scripts, Inc.; Evernorth Health, Inc.; Medoc Health Services, Inc.; and Ascent Health Services LLC ("ESI Respondents") in the above-captioned proceeding. Mercer respectfully requests that the deadline to file a motion to quash or limit the subpoena be extended by 30 days from January 9, 2025 to January 17, 2025.

On December 30, 2024, ESI Respondents' counsel served the Subpoena to counsel by

email with a return date of January 18, 2025. Pursuant to Rule 3.34(c), Mercer has ten days from

the date of service to move to limit or quash the Subpoena. Thus, Mercer's current deadline to file

a motion to limit or quash the Subpoena is January 9, 2025.

ESI Respondents' counsel does not oppose this motion. Granting the proposed extension

will allow counsel for Mercer, ESI Respondents, and other Respondents to continue negotiating in

good faith in an effort to narrow or limit any disputes about the subpoenas issued to Mercer.

This motion is made in good faith and not for purposes of delay. Mercer has not requested

any previous extensions regarding the Subpoena. Moreover, given the current fact discovery

deadline of June 6, 2025, granting this requested extension will not delay the progress of this

proceeding.

Accordingly, and for good cause shown, Mercer respectfully requests that its deadline to

move to limit or quash the Subpoena be extended until January 17, 2025. A proposed order

granting the requested relief is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Mercer makes this motion without prejudice to its right to seek further extensions.
