# UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR FURTHER EXTENSION OF TIME FOR NON-PARTY MERCER (US) LLC TO MOVE TO LIMIT OR QUASH SUBPOENAS

Non-party Mercer (US) LLC ("Mercer"), by and through its undersigned counsel, moves pursuant to Rules 3.22, 3.34, and 4.3(b) of the Federal Trade Commission's Rules of Practice for Adjudicative Proceedings to extend the time to move to quash or limit the subpoenas *duces tecum* served by Respondents Caremark Rx, LLC and Zinc Health Services, LLC ("Caremark/Zinc Subpoena") and Express Scripts, Inc.; Evernorth Health, Inc.; Medoc Health Services, Inc.; and Ascent Health Services LLC ("ESI Subpoena") in the above-captioned proceeding. Mercer respectfully requests that the deadline to file a motion to quash or limit these subpoenas be

extended 30 days from January 17, 2025 to January 31, 2025. Caremark/Zinc Respondents and ESI Respondents do not oppose the requested relief.

The Caremark/Zinc Subpoena was served on December 11, 2024. Pursuant to Rule 3.34(c), Mercer's deadline to file a motion to limit or quash the Caremark/Zinc Subpoena was December 23, 2024. Counsel conferred on Thursday, December 19, 2024, and agreed that an extension would allow the meet-and-confer process to continue. Mercer filed an unopposed motion for an extension on December 23, 2024, and this Court granted Mercer's motion and set a deadline of January 17, 2025, for Mercer to move to limit or quash the Caremark/Zinc Subpoena.

The ESI Subpoena was served on December 30, 2024. Pursuant to Rule 3.34(c), Mercer's deadline to file a motion to limit or quash the ESI Subpoena was January 9, 2025. Counsel for ESI Respondents agreed that an extension would allow Mercer, ESI Respondents, and other Respondents to continue negotiating in good faith to narrow or limit any disputes about the subpoenas issued to Mercer. Mercer filed an unopposed motion for an extension on January 9, 2025, and this Court granted Mercer's motion and set a deadline of January 17, 2025, for Mercer to move to limit or quash the ESI Subpoena.

Counsel for Mercer, counsel for Caremark/Zinc Respondents, and counsel for ESI Respondents have communicated about the subpoenas and intend to continue doing so; further, counsel for Caremark/Zinc Respondents and counsel for ESI Respondents both indicated that they do not oppose the extension sought in this motion. Granting the proposed extension will allow counsel to continue negotiating in good faith in an effort to narrow or limit any disputes. This motion is made in good faith and not for purposes of delay. Moreover, given the current fact discovery deadline of June 6, 2025, granting this requested extension will not delay the progress of this proceeding.

Accordingly, and for good cause shown, Mercer respectfully requests that its deadline to move to limit or quash the Subpoena be extended until January 31, 2025. A proposed order granting the requested relief is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Mercer makes this motion without prejudice to its right to seek further extensions.
